1. Palpi as long as proboscis
2. Scutellum rounded



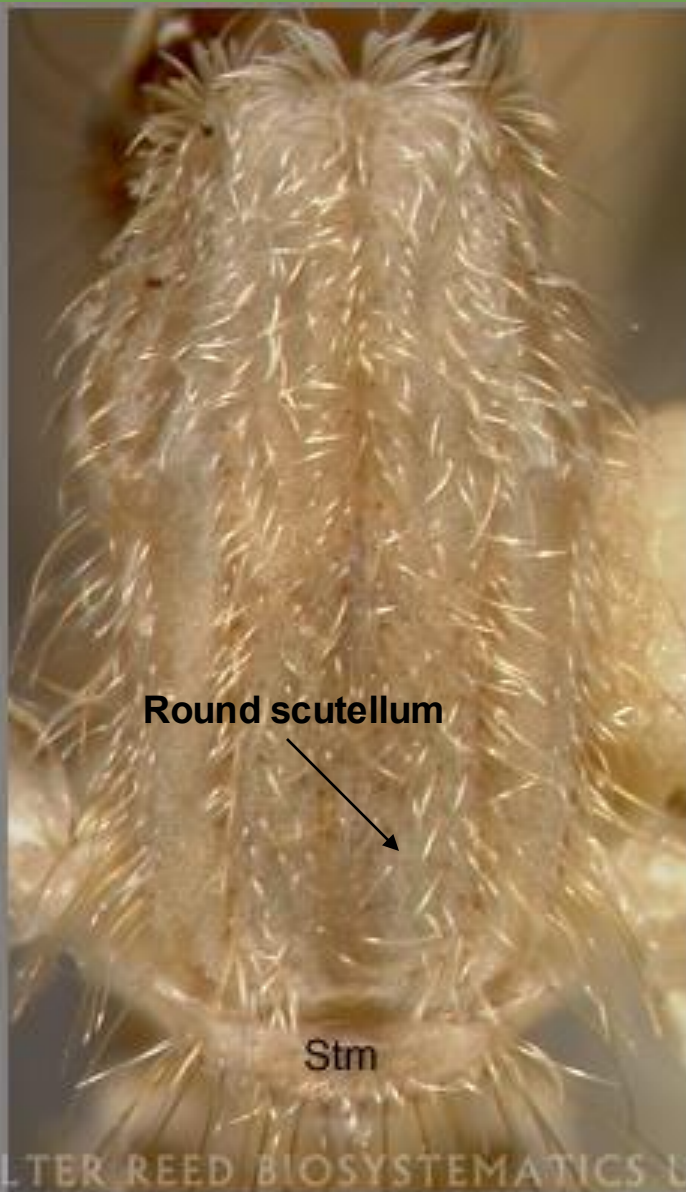

2. Wings with apical pale spot
3. Wing vein 1A with 3 dark spots

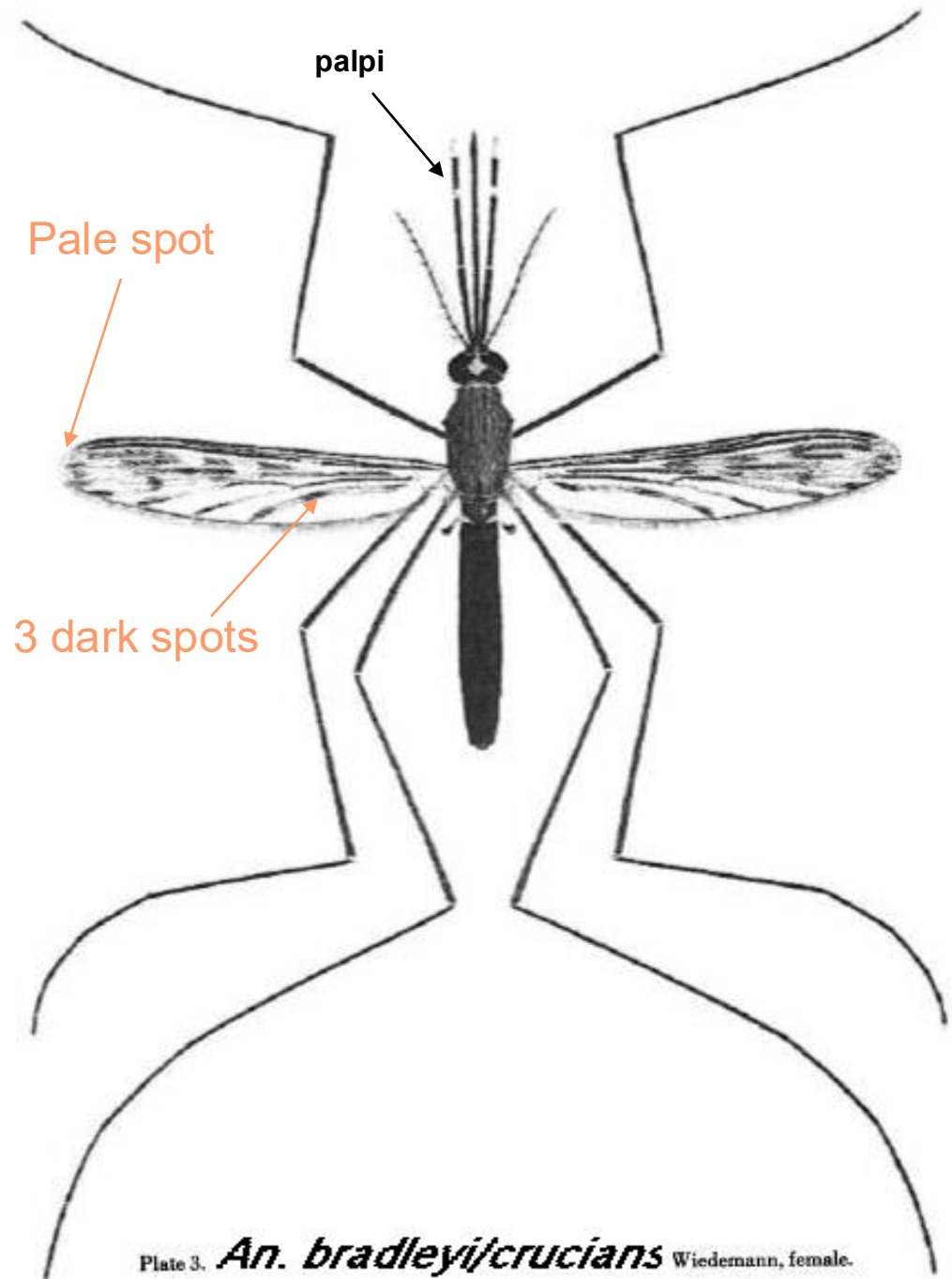


Plate 3. *An. bradleyi/crucians* Wiedemann, female.

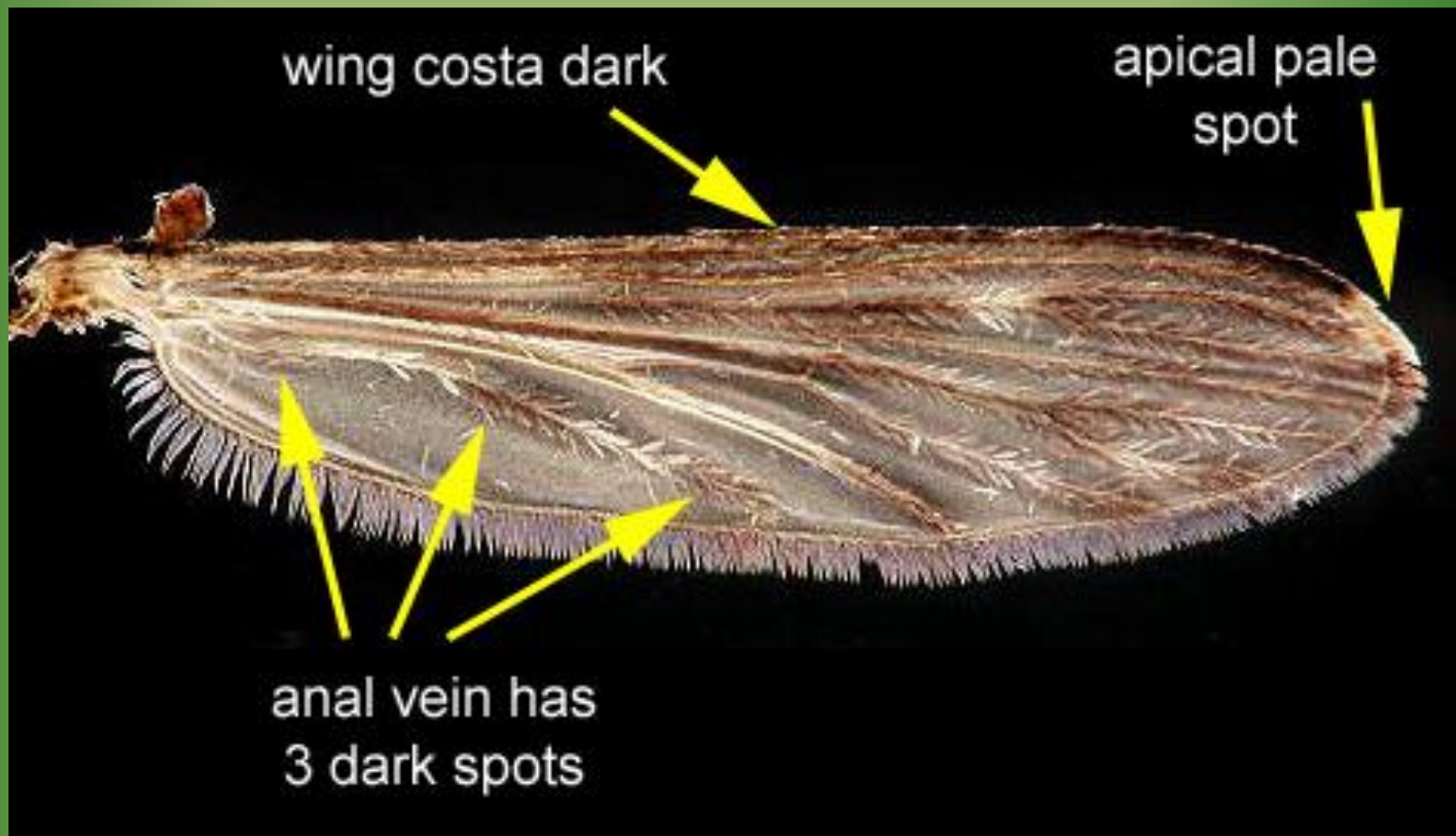

1. Palpi dark
2. Light patch on subcostal wing vein and at wing tip
3. Wing vein 1A with 2 dark spots

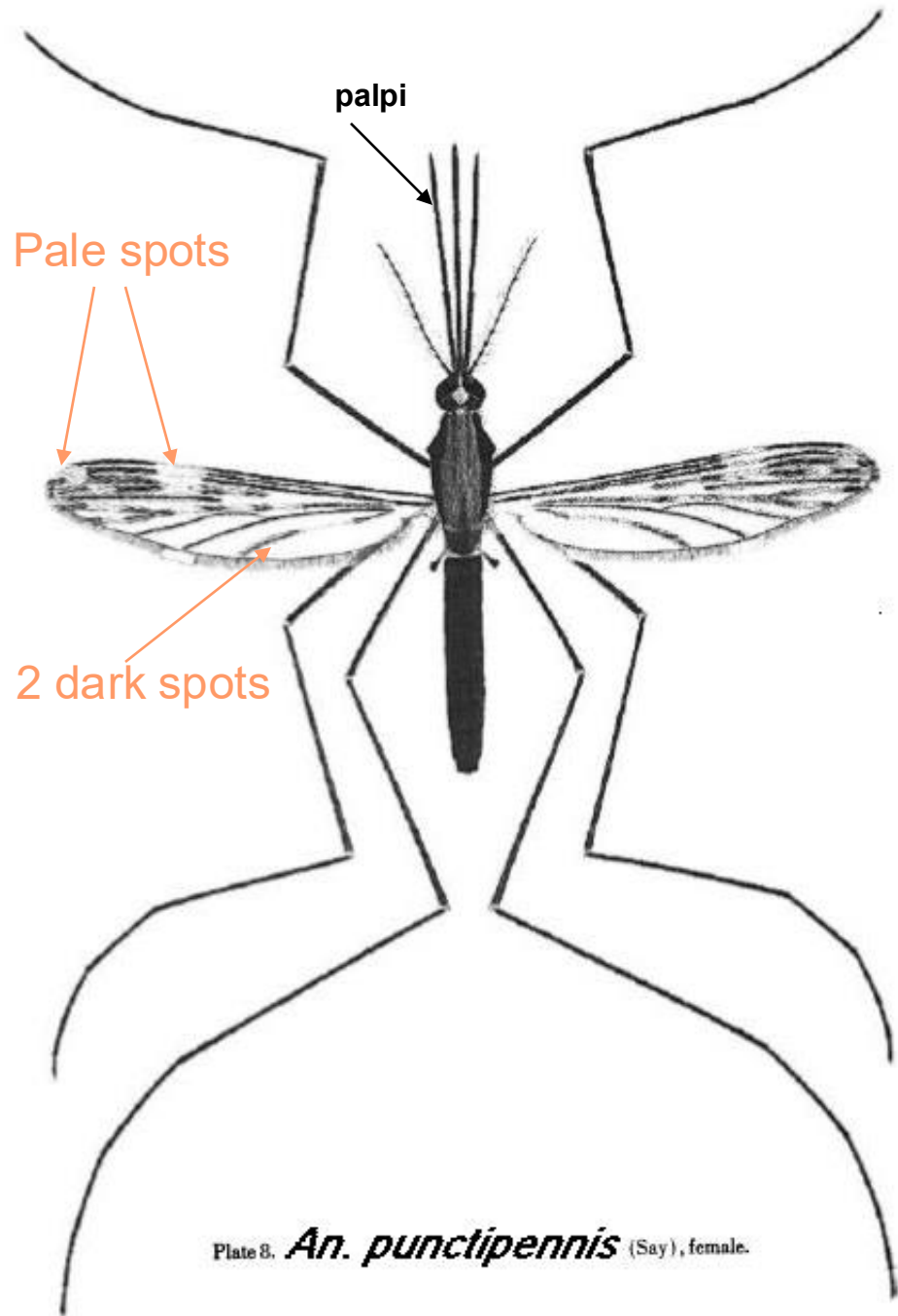


Plate 8. *An. punctipennis* (Say), female.

4 dark spots

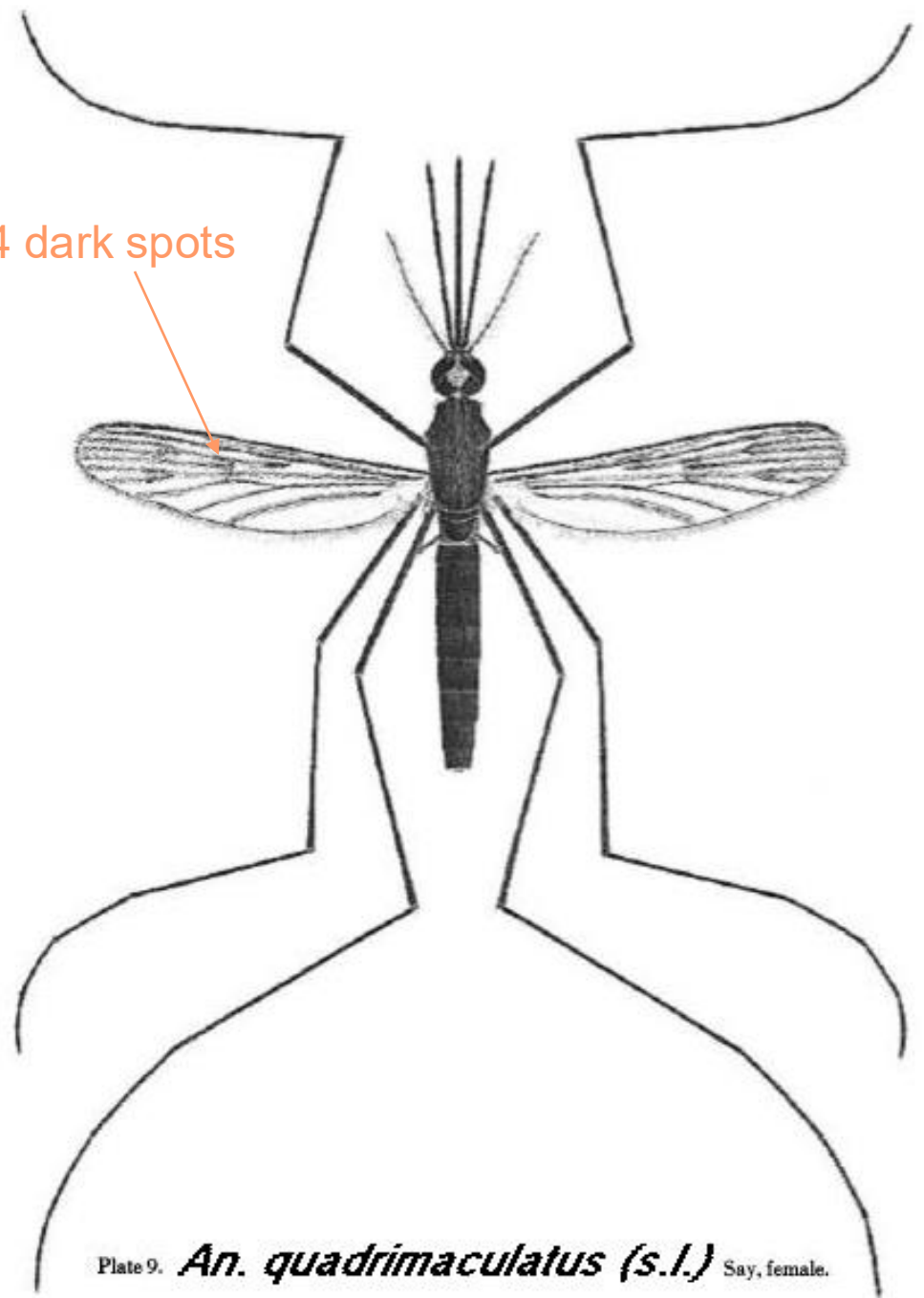


Plate 9. *An. quadrimaculatus (s.l.)* Say, female.

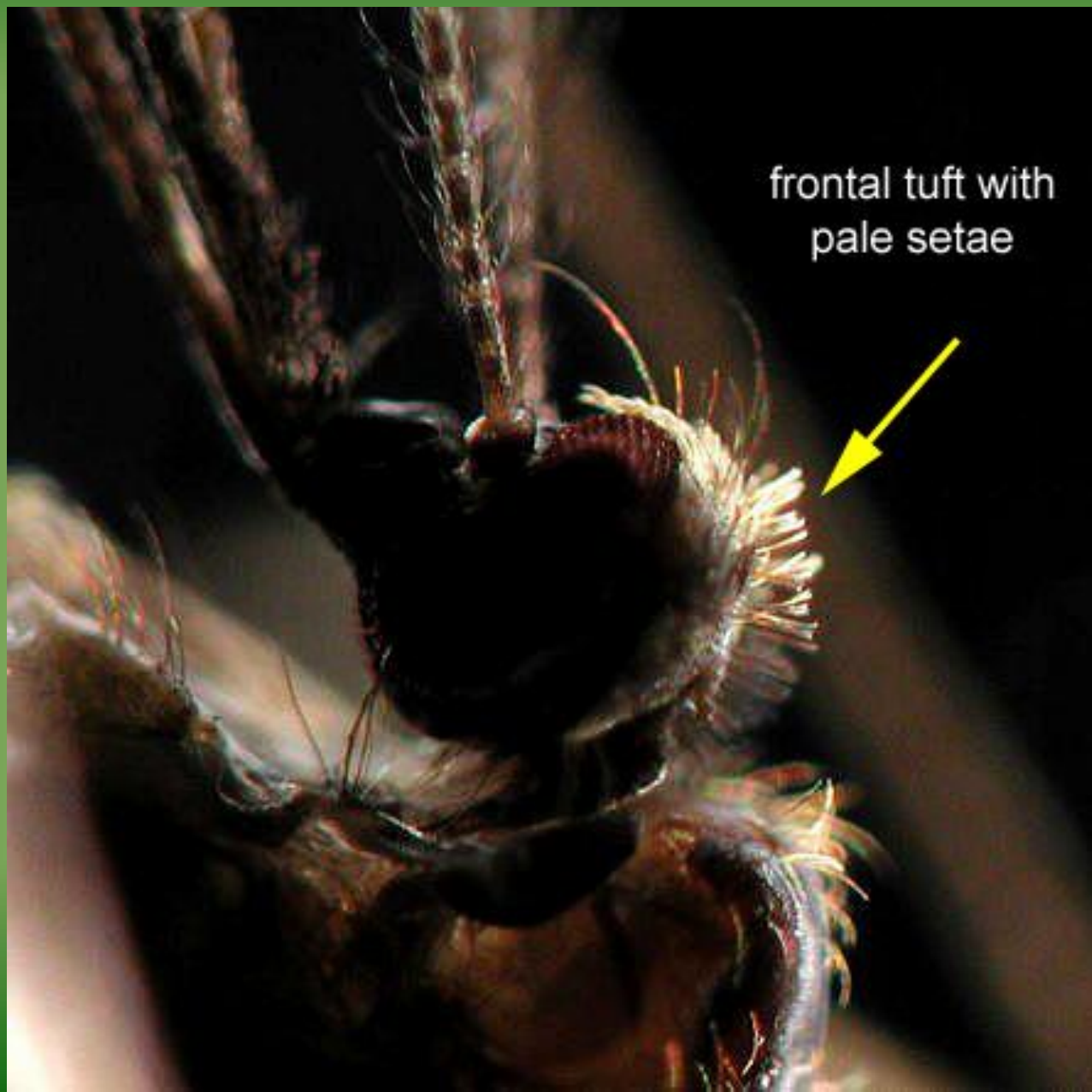

2. Dark wings
3. Palpi dark
4. All dark setae on head
5. Black scales on forecoxa

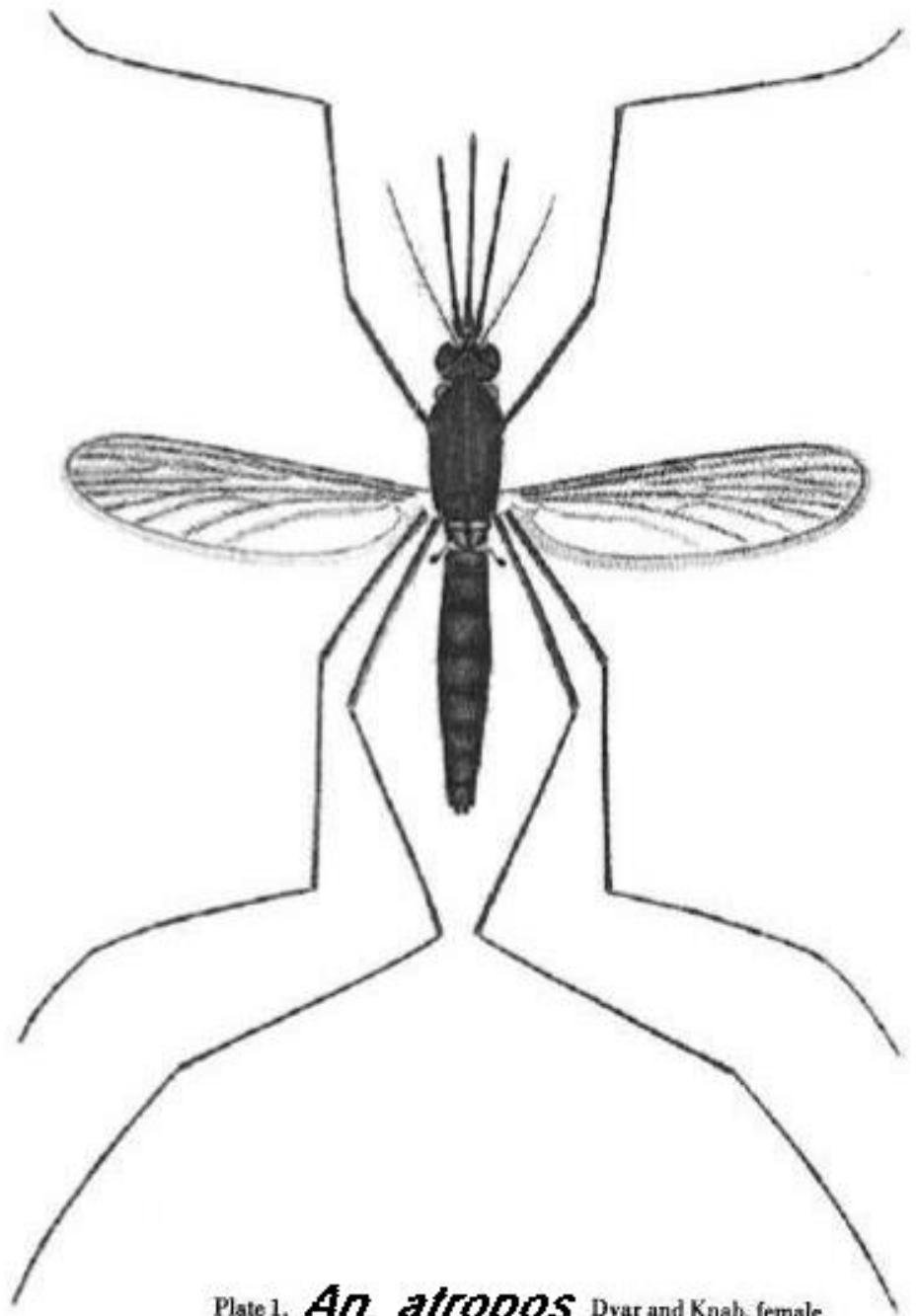


Plate 1. *An. atropos* Dyar and Knab, female.

1. Tree hole mosquito
2. Wings dark, no spots
3. Pale scales behind eyes
4. Longer scutal setae

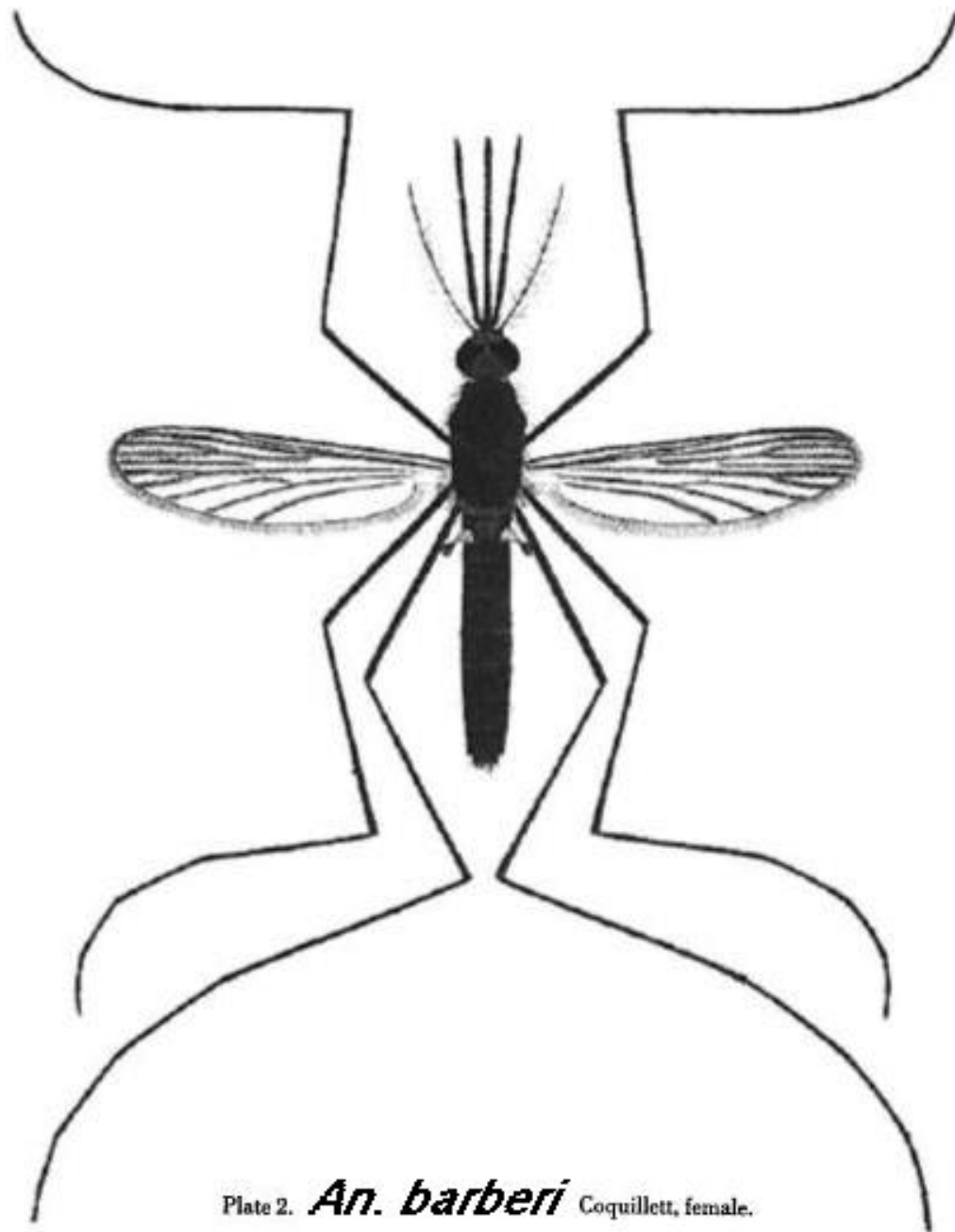


Plate 2. *An. barberi* Coquillett, female.

1. Wings all dark
2. Head setae with light patches
3. Palpi banded
4. Knob of halter white
5. Femur with pale-scaled knee spots
6. Rare

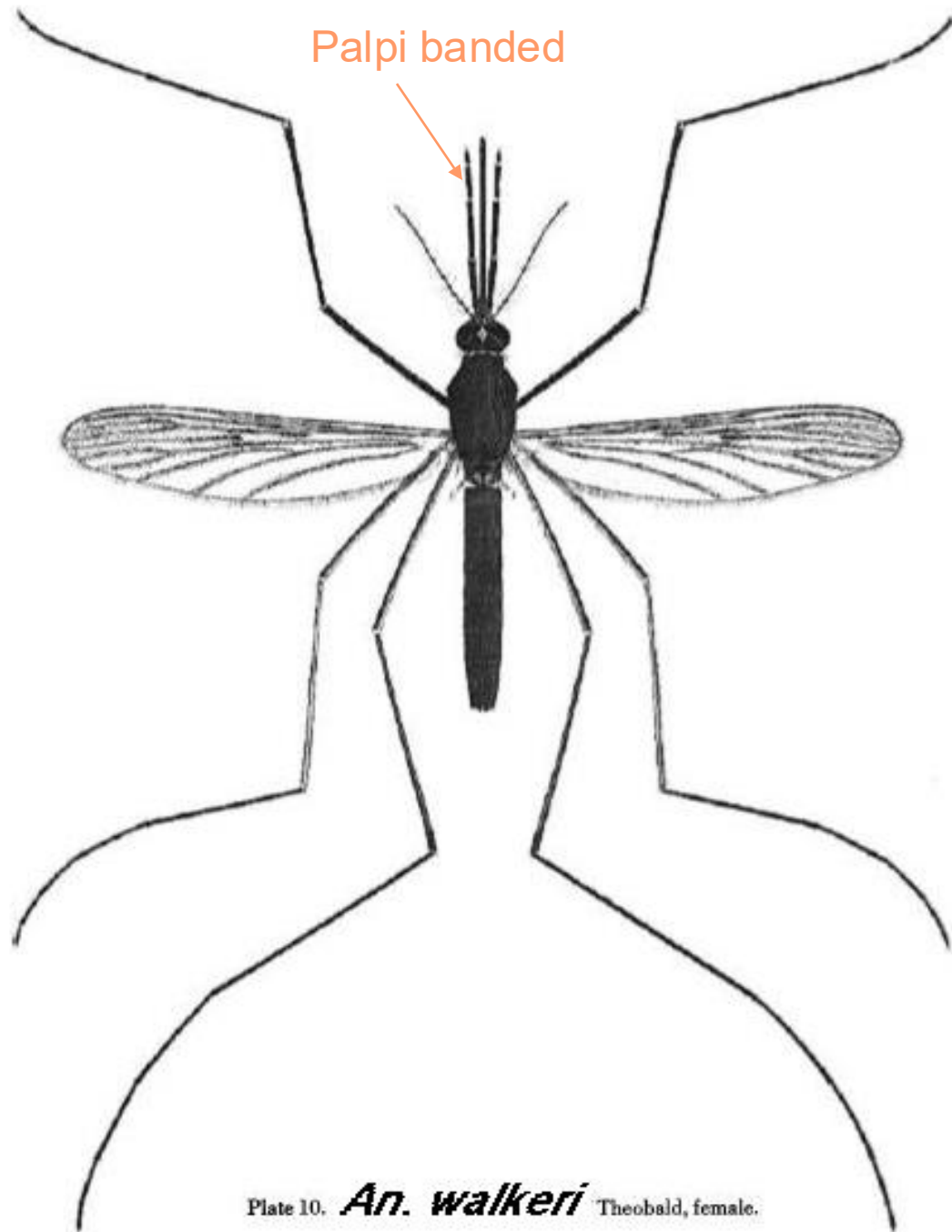


Plate 10. *An. walkeri* Theobald, female.
